state funds are available to cover mammograms, Pap tests, and follow-up diagnostic exams for biopsies and surgical consultations, as well as office visits for clinical breast and pelvic examinations. For those women who are not covered by insurance and who are not eligible for the CBCCEDP grant, a grant from the Charlotte Johnson Hollfelder Foundation can also cover the cost of mammograms.

Diabetes Education

The Joslin Diabetes Center at The Hospital of Central Connecticut, which is affiliated with the world-renowned Joslin Diabetes Center in Boston, MA, offers various educational programs.

Support Groups

The Hospital of Central Connecticut sponsors a variety of support groups for patients and their families in the areas of childbirth and parenting, diabetes, weight management, and obesity. Several cancer support groups meet monthly tailored to individual needs, e.g. prostate cancer, living with cancer, and women's cancer support.

MOMS Program

Mothers Offering Mothers Support is a peer-guided self-help group sponsored by The Hospital of Central Connecticut for women 22 years of age or younger who are pregnant or have infants. Participants benefit from mutual support and gain parenting skills by sharing with others. This outreach program offers free transportation, a meal, and child care.

Health Promotion Programs

The Hospital of Central Connecticut's Health Promotion Department offers free or low-cost cholesterol and blood pressure screening, flu clinics, ACLS/PALS and CPR instruction, and women's programs. More than 5,000 visits are logged annually for these programs.

Outpatient Clinics

The Hospital offers low-cost healthcare through its several outpatient clinics — medical, pediatric, OB/GYN, and orthopedics. Many community members who would otherwise not have access to regular healthcare receive the expert compassionate care they need here. Multilingual staff or translators are available.
