Day Kimball Hospital is a 104-bed, acute care community hospital located in Putnam, Connecticut. Founded in 1894, Day Kimball provides for the healthcare needs of Northeastern Connecticut, nearby Massachusetts, and Rhode Island.

The hospital offers acute and general medical/surgical care, 24-hour emergency services, prompt care, obstetrics, oncology and hematology, pediatrics, rehabilitation services, cardiopulmonary rehabilitation, psychiatric care, and hospitalist services. The more than 1,000 employees and 190 affiliated medical staff represent various specialties through the hospital and its medical centers in Danielson, Dayville, Plainfield, and Thompson. In addition, home care, homemakers, hospice and palliative care services are provided through the hospital's agencies.

Centers for Healthy Aging

The hospital staffs three Centers for Healthy Aging. The Centers, located in Putnam, Brooklyn, and Plainfield, provide screenings, check ups, health counseling, and education to seniors. The Centers now have a Geriatric Assessment Program, overseen by a geriatrician, which offers a comprehensive evaluation and planning program for seniors, their families, and their healthcare providers.

Day Kimball HomeCare

Day Kimball HomeCare provides patients with a comprehensive range of services, all in the comfort and privacy of their own homes. These services include highly advanced and specialized wound care, nursing, home health aide services, physical and speech therapy, IV therapy treatments, and medical social work. Day Kimball HomeCare recently received acceptance to the Visiting Nurses Association of America (VNAA) CHAMP Program.

Day Kimball HomeMakers

Day Kimball HomeMakers provide in-home support services to people requiring help with all aspects of daily living. HomeMakers provide general housecleaning, shopping, meal preparation, medical supervision, and companion services to medical appointments and errands, and a Personal Care Assistant program. Day Kimball HomeMakers works closely with visiting nurses, home health aides, and other community based providers.

Hospice & Palliative Care of Northeastern Connecticut

The first hospice in Windham County, Hospice and Palliative Care of Northeastern Connecticut, brings dignity and comfort to those who may be facing the final stages of life. A palliative care program has been added to provide additional services to those who continue to seek quality of life as they deal with the pain, symptoms, and associated complications of life-threatening illness.
