Greenwich Hospital is a 174-bed non-profit community hospital serving lower Fairfield County, CT and Westchester County, NY. It is an academic affiliate of Yale University School of Medicine and a member of the Yale-New Haven Health System. Since its founding in 1903, Greenwich Hospital has evolved into a progressive medical center and teaching institution with an internal medicine residency. The hospital represents all medical specialties and offers a wide range of medical, surgical, diagnostic, and wellness programs.

High quality, personalized medical care; a beautiful new facility recognized for its healing environment; and convenient location are reasons many patients choose to be treated here. Greenwich Hospital's unwavering commitment to service excellence contributes to patient satisfaction scores that consistently rank in the top one percent of hospitals nationwide. In 2005, the hospital opened its new Olive and Thomas J. Watson, Jr. Pavilion, a 150,000-square-foot addition that completed an ambitious, multi-year modernization effort that completely replaced the Greenwich Hospital building that existed in 1996.

SERVING OUR COMMUNITY'S NEEDS

Greenwich Hospital plays a major role in improving and maintaining community health through its outreach arm, Community Health at Greenwich Hospital and other departments. The hospital continually expands its many offerings, which include regular community health screenings, classes, and support groups for patients with chronic conditions such as cancer, diabetes, pain, and heart and lung disease. A community health status assessment sponsored by the hospital has identified several additional opportunities for improved healthcare. Already this has resulted in expanded dental services for low-income children and extended outpatient clinic hours for adults. The hospital also has partnered with Greenwich Library to form a Health Information Center at the library. Health-related books, videos, journals, and computer databases are all available, along with assistance from specially trained librarians.

Special Seminars and Events Teach the Latest on Prevention and Treatment

A variety of topics such as integrative medicine, joint replacement, women's heart health, and osteoporosis are addressed in regular public forums. The hospital's popular Teddy Bear Clinic, where children bring stuffed toys for evaluation and treatment, helps alleviate their fear of healthcare procedures.

Parish Nurse Program Reaches Out

Greenwich Hospital and the First Congregational Church of Greenwich have teamed up to offer the first Parish Nurse Program in Greenwich. A registered nurse is available part-time to conduct blood pressure checks, counsel church members on how to care for themselves and loved ones, and share information on hospital and community resources.

Cancer Counseling Helps Patients Cope

The Bendheim Cancer Center offers free cancer counseling to the hospital's cancer patients and their families. Cancer counseling can help reduce the stress that accompanies a cancer diagnosis, solve practical problems that may arise during treatment, and address concerns about recurrence. The initiative is part of the Center's goal of offering complete care to its patients.

Support for Parents—Before and After the Baby, and Beyond

The Tender Beginnings Program at Greenwich Hospital is a wonderful way for couples and families to prepare for labor, delivery, and baby care. Moms, dads, siblings, and grandparents can take advantage of courses taught by Greenwich Hospital maternity nurses—many of whom are certified educators and consultants on their topics. While some require a small fee, others, on such topics as early pregnancy, baby care, baby food preparation, and siblings, are offered at no charge. The hospital's Integrative Medicine Program offers fee-based prenatal, postnatal, and infant massage, as well as massage during labor. Advice and skills for the full parenting journey, from babyhood through adolescence, can be gotten through the long-running Parents Exchange series.
