## PROVIDING STATE-OF-THE-ART CARE

Saint Francis Hospital and Medical Center is a leader in introducing state-of-the-art medical technology to Connecticut. The hospital was the first in the state to acquire the CyberKnife® radiosurgery system which permits surgeons and radiation oncologists to treat tumors previously considered inoperable.

The *Connecticut CyberKnife® Center* at Saint Francis features the world's most accurate, real-time radiation therapy equipment, capable of treating tumors and lesions anywhere in the body with sub-millimeter accuracy, painlessly and noninvasively. Saint Francis' CyberKnife system integrates an imaging system that continuously verifies tumor location and automatically compensates for movement. A multi-



jointed robotic arm rotates and directs precision beams of radiation from multiple angles. As a result, the CyberKnife system adjusts itself to patient movement and targets tumors with pinpoint accuracy.

Saint Francis also employs da Vinci® Robotic Surgical System. The technology permits surgeons to perform complex operations using robotic devices to cut tissue, suture and complete other precise tasks. Patients benefit from minimal incisions and faster recovery times.

The hospital is also equipped with a 128-slice dual source CT scanner, offering the greatest temporal resolution and permitting moving organs to be frozen in time and space for detailed images. Saint Francis' electrophysiology laboratory is equipped with the Stereotaxis Magnetic Navigation System for the treatment of atrial fibrillation.

Construction of a new ten-story patient tower is underway. The 310,000 square-foot structure will contain a new Emergency Department that doubles patient capacity over the hospital's current Emergency Department, dedicated facilities for the Connecticut Joint Replacement Institute, replacement operating rooms, and replacement patient rooms.
