Founded in 1826 as Connecticut's first and the nation's fourth voluntary hospital, Yale-New Haven Hospital (YNHH) is a 944-bed tertiary referral center, including Yale-New Haven Children's Hospital and the Yale-New Haven Psychiatric Hospital. YNHH is the primary teaching hospital for the Yale University School of Medicine and provides a full range of high-quality, cost-effective patient care services. Yale-New Haven Hospital has been nationally recognized by *U.S. News & World Report* in its Honor Roll of America's Best Hospitals for the past two years. In addition, YNHH has nationally recognized centers of excellence in heart disease and heart surgery, gastroenterology, gynecology, cancer, hormonal disorders, kidney disease, otolaryngology, psychiatry, respiratory diseases, pediatrics, and transplantation. YNHH and its affiliates are a key component of Yale New Haven Health, an integrated healthcare delivery system with three corporately consolidated hospitals and local health networks serving Connecticut and neighboring states.

## SERVING OUR COMMUNITY'S NEEDS

**Primary Care Center** – Provides outpatient medical services to the community, primarily the uninsured and underinsured populations. It is the largest outpatient facility in the city of New Haven. In 2007, YNHH had 536,554 outpatient visits, including 122,775 emergency department visits and 47,826 Primary Care Center visits.

**School-Based Health Centers** – YNHH has seven school-based health centers in greater New Haven, which had more than 7,000 visits in 2007.

**Community Investment Program** – In partnership with the City of New Haven and the Hill Development Corporation, YNHH provides direct funding and in-kind support in the areas identified by the community – safe and affordable housing, child care, youth services, education, community health outreach, jobs, job fairs and training, economic development, education, and voluntary payments. In the past two years, YNHH has:

- Made \$2.96 million in voluntary payments to the city of New Haven
- Provided \$300,000 for economic development in New Haven
- Supported \$420,000 for city health outreach coordinators
- Given \$300,000 to the Mayor's Youth Initiative and \$150,000 to Hill youth programs

**Community Outreach** – Through its leadership of the Greater New Haven Partnership for a Healthy Community, as well as various YNHH initiatives, the Community Health Program improved the health of area residents through several community health initiatives.

- **Pediatric Dental Program** serves uninsured or underinsured and medically compromised children
- **Greater New Haven Asthma Initiative**, led by YNHH, trains healthcare providers in the clinical pathways for the most appropriate treatment of asthmatics.
- **Sickle Cell Program** holds a weekly clinic for high-risk adults and the program coordinator provides health education to the community, patients, families, and healthcare providers.
- **Community Health Fairs**, which YNHH hosts and/or participates in, offer free health screenings and health education and healthcare career education to the greater New Haven community.
- **Mobile mammography van**, the first digital mammography van in New England, performed 2,236 screenings at community health fairs, senior centers, and businesses from New London to Meriden in the past year.
- **Partners in Education** – YNHH reaches over 4,000 students, grades K-12, with services and programs related to health promotion and education, career exploration, and volunteer service opportunities.
- **Men's Health Enrichment Program** – YNHH helps identify and assist men in need of primary care services or baseline physical examinations and provides outreach education and seminars to men in the community.
- **Wellness Information Network (WIN) Program** – In 2007, YNHH identified 308 uninsured or underinsured people who were referred to the WIN Program, which matches patients with medical homes.
- **AIDS Care Program** – YNHH's AIDS Care Program provides comprehensive care to adults, adolescents and children living with HIV/AIDS, as well as education, outreach, counseling and testing, outpatient and inpatient clinical care, and clinical trials.
