

2021 Annual Connecticut Perinatal Quality Collaborative Quality Conference and AIM Meeting

Join CHA for the 14th annual Connecticut Perinatal Quality Collaborative (CPQC) Quality Conference and second annual AIM Meeting. This year's virtual conference features a keynote address on burnout and its impacts on quality improvement progress.

Conference sessions will present successful strategies during the pandemic that empower pregnant persons to monitor and manage severe maternal hypertension at home; address COVID-19 vaccination disparities in pregnant and postpartum birthing persons; and the COVID-19 vaccine for children. The Conference ends with an *optional* session on the AIM data portal.

The target audience includes perinatal care providers, obstetricians, neonatologists, labor and delivery nurses, physicians, nurses, and others who work with this patient population.

At the conclusion of this program, participants will be able to:

- Explain the difference between stress and burnout.
- Describe the three main symptoms of burnout, and how they differ in men and women; explain and practice the three burnout prevention tools.
- Discuss the association between burnout and quality of care, safety and medical errors, and patient satisfaction.
- Discuss the progress made since the implementation of AIM (Alliance for Innovation on Maternal Health) in Connecticut.
- Describe outpatient Obstetrical management during a pandemic.
- Discuss the use of electronic medical records with patients to document blood pressures.
- Articulate the importance of COVID-19 vaccination during and after pregnancy, and in pediatrics; examine the COVID-19 vaccination rates during pregnancy.
