**Brief Program Description:**

The unique needs of a patient who reports a sexual assault often strain an already overburdened healthcare system. Yet it remains critically important for responding healthcare personnel to understand and address those needs. It is not enough to be a skilled healthcare professional, one must provide a patient-centered clinical response while remaining an unbiased member of the evidence collection process — all while delivering care as part of a dynamic multidisciplinary team.

CHA is pleased to partner with the Connecticut Office of Victim Services to offer two opportunities for nurses to participate in a three-hour virtual training that will provide a background perspective on the care of **adolescent and adult** patients who report a sexual assault, the importance of consistent care for these individuals, and an explanation of available resources such as the [State of Connecticut Technical Guidelines for Health Care Response to Patients Who Report A Sexual Assault](#), followed by a step-by-step explanation of all the components of both the CT100B and CT400A Sexual Assault Evidence Collection Kits.

**Denise S. Covington, MBA, MSN, RN, SANE-A**

Denise S. Covington is a board-certified Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner for Adults and Adolescents, with a background in emergency nursing. In 2010, Ms. Covington developed and implemented a Sexual Assault Forensic Examiners (SAFE) Program for the Connecticut Judicial Branch, Office of Victim Services, including its infrastructure and alliances with local, state and federal agencies. This program serves to ensure skilled, professional trauma-informed treatment of patients who report a sexual assault within Connecticut's acute care hospitals. Additionally, Ms. Covington has been a member of the International Association of Forensic Nurses (IAFN) since 1997, and served on the Board of Directors of the IAFN from 2019 – 2021. She Chaired the Board as President in 2020. Previously she served as Chair of the Planning Committee for the IAFN's 2016 and 2017 International Conference on Forensic Nursing Science and Practice in Denver, Colorado and Toronto, Canada, respectively.

**Patricia Moriarty, APRN, FNP-BC, SANE-A**, a board certified sexual assault forensic examiner (SAFE), has worked with the Gail Burns-Smith Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner Program (SAFE Program) at the state of Connecticut Judicial Branch Office of Victim Services since 2017. In



2019, Patricia became the SAFE Program Training Manager coordinating both the SAFE Program Training as well as community sexual assault response trainings. Patricia has also functioned clinically in the community as a family nurse practitioner since 2003 where she has cared for many individuals seeking forensic examination and evidence collection.
